Our campuses

We have three main campuses: Abbey Park Campus, Freeman's Park Campus and St Margaret's Campus. Different subjects are taught at different campuses, so check where you'll be studying if you choose to apply to us.

Getting to Leicester College is easy. All the campuses are close to the city centre, with great transport links.

Your options

After GCSEs there are lots of options open to you. What suits you is quite likely to be different to some of your friends, and will depend on what you want to do for a career in the future.

There are two main routes after school: academic and technical. Academic includes qualifications like A levels and the International Baccalaureate.

Technical and vocational qualifications focus on the career you want to do and include T levels, BTECs and apprenticeships. They will give you considerable practical experience, as well as theoretical knowledge.

This can help to springboard you into a job or higher education.



Apprenticeships

An apprenticeship is a job with training. You'll spend 80% of your time in work and 20% doing off the job training, which will include time at college.

Like any other job you need to search out opportunities and apply for them. If shortlisted, you'll be invited for an interview and then if successful you'll land the job.

We offer apprenticeships from level 2 (the same level as GCSEs) through to university level.

T levels

T levels are a new level 3 qualification for people under 19. They combine practical study with an industry placement, so you spend 80% of your time at college and 20% at an industry placement.

This gives you the opportunity to put what you have learnt into practice.

They are equivalent to 3 A levels, and you can go onto university or higher education with them, or straight into work.

Other technical qualifications

BTECs and other technical qualifications such as OCR, are practical and provide hands-on experience that provide a clear pathway to employment.

They are a great alternative to academic qualifications.

We offer courses from entry level through to level 3 for young people leaving school.



What's on campus

Being a student at Leicester College is not just about your course work. You will meet new people and make new friends. You can also try your hand at lots of different activities.





We have a thriving Student Union, which allows you to get involved with things like charity

events, fundraising and political campaigning.

We also have a Student Enrichment Team (SET) that organises a huge range of activities and events throughout the year to give you the opportunity to get involved in sports, volunteering, cultural and religious celebrations, fun and educational trips and much more.

If you need childcare, we have two onsite nurseries which offer flexible and affordable childcare.

You can also get a TOTUM card as a student that gives you access to hundreds of discounts. You'll also get access to the full Office 365 suite too.

Of course, each campus has a library. You'll also find a social space at each campus where you can relax, reflections room (for prayer or just if you need some space for mindfulness), and a canteen.

We have specialist teams of staff who work with students who need extra support to prepare them for college.

What does it cost?

There are no tuition fees or exams fees for UK or qualifying residents who are:

- **16-18 years old on 31 August 2024**
- **19-24 years old on 31 August 2024 and have an Education and Health Care Plan (EHCP)**

There may be some other costs attached to the course, for example for materials of uniform.

If you are a looked after child, your parent(s)/carer(s) earn less than £33,000 or £18,525* for a single person, or they are unemployed you can apply to our Learner Support Fund for help with costs for things like buses passes, course kit, uniforms, and equipment.

What happens next?

After you apply, we will send you an acknowledgement letter and a conditional offer. This will tell you what grades you need to get to secure your place, as well as any other things that you need to do, for example coming in for an interview or a welcome event.

How to apply?

Many schools use a common application system called PS16 to support their students to apply. If your school uses this, you will be given a login by your school and can apply through PS16.
