GCSE adult pathway – gain 5 GCSEs in just one year which can include maths and English.





ACCESS

Access courses are equivalent to 3 A levels and provide a flexible and inclusive pathway to a university education. Choose from health professions, humanities, science, social science, business studies, and engineering.



HIGHER EDUCATION

You can choose to study for a university level qualification in just one or two years with a HNC, HND, Foundation Degree or a teaching qualification. Choose from: art, design and graphics; artistic makeup; built environment and construction; business management; computing and digital; engineering; fashion and footwear; healthcare; music, performing arts, music technology; and photography.

WHAT'S ON CAMPUS

Being a student at Leicester College is not just about your course work. You will meet new people and make new friends.

We have a thriving Student Union, which allows you to get involved with things like events, fundraising and political campaigning.

We also have a Student Enrichment Team (SET) that organises a huge range of events throughout the year, such as sports, volunteering, cultural and religious celebrations and much more.

If you need childcare, we have two onsite nurseries, which offer flexible and affordable childcare.

You can also get a TOTUM card as a student that gives you access to hundreds of discounts. You'll also get access to full Office 365 suite too.

Of course, each campus has a library. You'll also find a social space at each campus where you can relax, reflection room (for prayer or just if you need some space for mindfulness), and a canteen.

For higher education students you'll also have access to our HE hubs at Abbey Park and St Margaret's Campuses that provide quiet social and study spaces.



Funding for education in England is quite complicated. Who pays course fees depends on a number of factors including what previous qualifications you have, the type of qualification you are applying to study, your age and your income.

If you are age 19-23* and studying for your first level 1, 2 or 3 course (you don't already have a qualification at the level you are applying for) then you do not have to pay course fees.


If you are age 19* or older and claim certain benefits most level 1 and 2 courses are free. People who earn less than £20,319 a year (this was the figure for 2023/24 and will be reviewed for courses starting in September 2024 by the government) can also study most level 2 courses for free.

If you have to pay for your course, you may be able to apply for an Advanced Learner Loan or a Student Finance Loan. Take a look at **gov.uk** for more information.

We also have a Learner Support Fund for students who may need help with things such as material fees, childcare, transport to and from college, and meals at college. If your gross household income if below £33,000, or below £18,525 if you are single you may be able to apply.
